Volunteers perform many functions to assist the hospital staff. Whether providing information to visitors or delivering food trays, volunteers are integral to our hospital.

Basic Requirements

- Complete an assessment of physical capabilities
- Attend hospital orientation
- Have a TB test during orientation
- Background check & drug screening
- Have hospital/department training in the area to be worked
- Adhere to volunteer uniform or dress standards
- Adhere to “Code of Conduct”
- Be punctual and reliable, displaying dignity, courtesy and consideration for others
- Volunteers cannot directly participate in or observe patient care without patient consent.

Additional Requirements for Adult Volunteers

Because the safety of our employees, patients and other volunteers is a priority, a criminal background check is required (paid for by the hospital).
